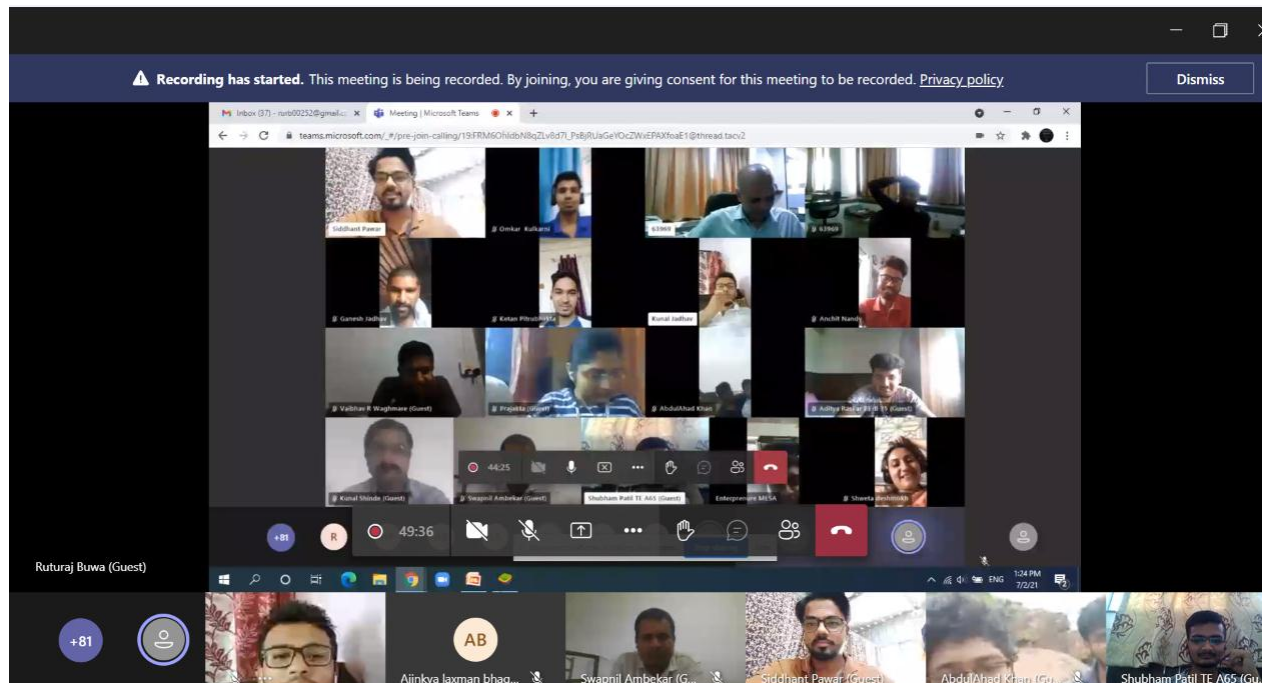
Objectives:

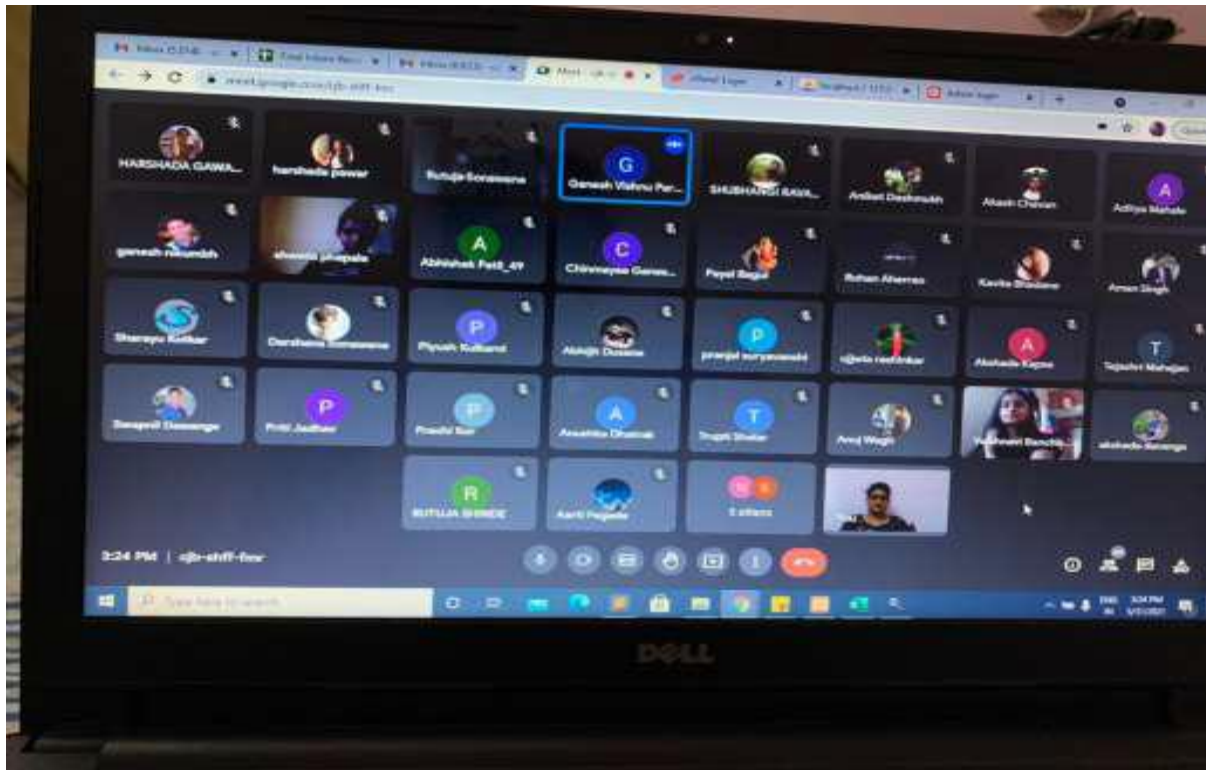
- The Make in India campaign is a government initiative to boost domestic manufacturing and help India become self-reliant.
- Aims to drive economic growth by creating jobs, fostering innovation, and enhancing industrial capabilities
- Aims to position India as a key player in the global economy.
- Aims to give India strategic autonomy in manufacturing so that it can rise to the occasion when needed.

Outcome:

- The campaign has also taken several policy initiatives to improve the ease of doing business in defense manufacturing, including: Liberalizing the process for granting industrial licenses, Clarifying the implementation of offset obligations, Announcing an export strategy, and Issuing export NOCs online.
